"Emergency service is a very important aspect of our community, and I understand the role of our fire departments," said publisher Andy Scheck, whose father worked for the fire service in Germany and who at 15 became a volunteer firefighter himself.

Our first fire article appeared on May 16, 2007. > Andrea Firth, the original Orinda beat writer, pushed management to include more fire reporting, and she wrote occasional articles over the first two years, mostly about MOFD. The blockbuster story during her tenure — and of the past 10 years — was the Pete Nowicki pension spiking fallout. After the board miscalculated the fire chief's pension based on incorrect information he submitted, the result cost the district millions of dollars and child for public pension abuse. Firth explained the situation clearly and without hysterics.
