Fast Times for Orinda Aquatics

arch and April were very successful months for the Orinda Aquatics Junior Group.

Established in 1995, Orinda Aquatics is a year-round USA Swimming program. The program is directed at all levels of swimming and dedicated to the maximum development of each swimmer, as both an athlete and an individual.

Swimmers ranging in age from 9 to 14 participated in four key meets, ending with the Junior Olympics (JO) Championship in San Ramon and the Far Western Championships in Morgan Hill. Thirty-eight swimmers posted over 300 lifetime best swims, eight Sectional Cuts, 11 new Pacific Reportable Times (PRT), 21 new Far Western times, 22 new Junior Olympic times and 20 new "A" times.

Mary Allison Ashby (12) placed first at the JO meet in the 50 back (27.87) and the 100 free (54.52) and fourth in the 50 fly (27.88)) and 500 free (5:18.71).

She broke the Pacific Swimming Record in the 100 back with a time of 58.38. Her 50 and 100 back times now rank in the All Time Top 100 Times in USA Swimming for 11-12 girls. Mary aged up to thirteen for the Far Western Championship and placed eighth in the 50 free (24.97).

Hannah Grubbs (13) came in second in the 200 back (2:06.97) and seventh in the 400 IM (4:46.41) at the JO meet. Her 100 back (58.43) placed sixth at the Far Western Championship. Her 100 and 200 back are both new Sectional Times.

Talbot Jacobs (13) entered seven events at Junior Olympics and achieved best times in each one. He racked up four new PRTs, placing second in the 200 back (2:02.44), fourth in the 100 back (57.67), fifth in the 200 free (1:51.62) and sixth in the 500 free (5:00.05).

eams from St. Perpetua and St. Monica ran on Friday and Saturday, May 7 and 8, at the annual CYO Track & Field Oakland Diocese Finals. Fifty parishes from Alameda and Contra Costa Counties, representing more than 4,000 athletes, came together at Granada High School in Livermore for two actionpacked days of running, jumping, and throwing.

The 2010 Season was the most successful in years for the two local teams, as 15 St. Monica and 20 St. Perpetua athletes qualified for the Diocesan Championship Meet.

Campolindo Senior Clears 28-year **Old Record**

lex Kalish is a senior at Campolindo and a pole-vaulter on the Campolindo Track and Field team. When he began competing on Saturday, May 1st at the Phillips-McCain Invitational, he was already the fifth-best pole vaulter in Campolindo history.

Kalish attempted to jump 13'-6". On his third attempt, he lifted over the bar and gave it the slightest touch. The bar stayed up, and Kalish matched his career best.

The bar was raised to 14 feet, an important psychological level. Two other competitors failed to clear the bar. Once again, on his third attempt, Alex cleared the bar and won the competition.

The bar was raised to 14'-6". On his third attempt Kalish cleared his personal best by a foot.

The bar was raised to 14'-8". Hans Florine, a speed rock climber and Campolindo graduate, challenged Kalish to beat his school record set in 1982 at 14'-6". Florine joked, "You'll never catch me."

Kalish again failed on his first two attempts, but again, he cleared it on his third attempt. Kalish is now the best pole vaulter in the history of Campolindo High School. Next fall he will attend Claremont McKenna College.
