Council Hears Zoning Update

The possible rezoning of the familiar "Christmas tree lot" property at the corner of Deer Hill Road and Pleasant Hill Road was less about substance than having a say during a lightly attended April 9 Lafayette City Council meeting. City Attorney Mala Subramanian read a prepared zoning update statement to the Council that described a brief history of the parcels along Deer Hill Road.

An application for development was received for a large multi-family project called the Terraces of Lafayette in the midst of city-spon-

sored discussions about possible down-zoning. Because the city is required to process the application, which includes an environmental review, an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is expected to be completed by late April that will outline impacts of the proposed devel-

"The data collected for the environmental review will likely provide new and useful information for the city as it makes final determinations regarding the most appropriate zoning designation for the property,"
