

## Acalanes, Miramonte advance to semifinals in NCS Tournament

No. 2 seed Acalanes (11-2-2) faced No. 15 Newark Memorial Cougars (8-9-6) in its firstround matchup last Wednesday, and handed their opponent a 4-0 shutout loss. Despite playgood job to keep their heads above and pull it out," according to head coach Evan Sassano.
